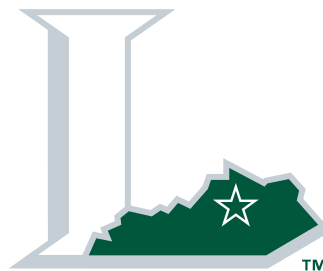

INSTRUCTIONS TO SCHOOLS INVOLVED IN STATE BASEBALL TOURNAMENT

Congratulations from the Board of Control and staff of the Kentucky High School Athletic Association on winning your regional championship and advancing to the Kentucky National Insurance/KHSAA State Baseball Tournament! We hope that these instructions answer most of your questions about your participation in the event..

THE INSTRUCTIONS GIVEN ON THESE PAGES ARE VERY IMPORTANT. PLEASE READ THIS INFORMATION IMMEDIATELY AND CONTACT ASSISTANT COMMISSIONER BUTCH COPE AT THE KHSAA OFFICES SHOULD YOU HAVE ANY QUESTIONS.

The KHSAA will have representatives available prior to the games at the KHSAA offices (859) 299-5472 throughout the week of the Tournament. You can contact Butch Cope directly through a tournament mobile phone, (859) 351-1833.

Thanks again, and best of luck in the tournament.

SPECIAL NOTE REGARDING TEAM ENTRY: All teams, even those who have just left the batting cages, must exit the stadium at the rear exit by the cages, and come around to Gate 2 for admission, even in the game you are about to play. You are not to enter the field through the outfield gates. Thank you for your cooperation in ensuring the integrity of admission control for both the Legends and the KHSAA.

STATE BASEBALL TOURNAMENT SUGGESTED DIRECTIONS

GENERAL

Whitaker Bank Ball Park (formerly Applebee's Park) is easy to find and easy to access. The site is just 1.5 miles North from the I-64 and I-75 interchange and less than one-quarter mile from New Circle Road. Right field is located along North Broadway (US 27-68), the number one gateway into Lexington. The park sits at 1200-1295 North Broadway, directly adjacent to the Northland Shopping Center. This is the location of the general parking for the park. Teams will park and enter via the Pass Gate on the third base line side. Each school will be provided five parking passes to allow you access to the team parking. All others will pay the normal parking fee. You must use one of these passes for your team bus. Please follow the directions of any Lexington Legends staff member monitoring the parking lots to minimize problems.

FROM EAST OF LEXINGTON (VIA I-64)

Take I-75 North at junction with I-64 West. Take exit 113 (Paris / Lexington), exit right. At exit traffic light, turn right to go to Park. Proceed through the third light (including the one at the exit), to the light at the entrance to the Park. Turn right to enter park.

FROM NORTH OF LEXINGTON (VIA I-75)

Take exit 113 (Paris / Lexington), exit right. At exit traffic light, turn right to go to Park. Proceed through the third light (including the one at the exit), to the light at the entrance to the Park. Turn right to enter park.

FROM SOUTH OF LEXINGTON (VIA I-75)

Take I-75 North to exit 113 (Paris / Lexington), exit right. At exit traffic light, turn right to go to Park. Proceed through the third light (including the one at the exit), to the light at the entrance to the Park. Turn right to enter park.

FROM SOUTH OF LEXINGTON (VIA US27, Nicholasville Road)

Follow Nicholasville Road toward Lexington. Come through downtown and continue on US 27 which has now become North Broadway. After passing Transylvania University, and several housing areas, Northland will appear on the left. Turn left to enter the park.

FROM WEST OF LEXINGTON (VIA Bluegrass Parkway or US60E)

Take the Bluegrass Parkway till it ends at Versailles Road. Make a right onto Versailles Road and travel east into Lexington. From Versailles Road, take the second New Circle Road exit heading northeast. Continue on New Circle Road to North Broadway. Make a right onto North Broadway and proceed to the park. Turn right to enter the park.

SCHEDULE OF GAMES

Weather permitting, the game dates and times have been set for this week's Tournament. You need to make no further arrangements in terms of game date and time. The schedule will be as follows (note this is not in bracket order, it is listed in order of games to be played) --

HOUSING

A complete list of the tournament lodging assignments is included in this material. Each property is holding a block of rooms for your squad until Sunday, June 2. You should contact the motel before 3 p.m. on that date to confirm or cancel your reservations.

Team housing for the baseball finals is arranged through the Lexington Convention and Visitors Bureau. As part of the bid package from the city of Lexington, the hotel has allotted each team a block of rooms at a discounted price. Other rooms may be slightly higher per room per night. When you call for rooms, ask for reservations and for the block under "KHSAA Baseball Tournament."

FAILURE TO STAY IN THE ASSIGNED PROPERTY WILL RESULT IN YOUR TEAM NOT RECEIVING A LODGING ALLOWANCE. You will be reimbursed for the nights you utilize the hotel, beginning the night before the tournament (should you choose to come in the night before), and going through the morning following elimination.

You can contact your hotel with questions, and are requested to comply with their needs for a rooming list as soon as feasible. Please feel free to contact the KHSAA office if you have any questions.

A list of the assigned hotels follows these instructions.

SPECIAL INFORMATION REGARDING TITLE REFERENCE TO TOURNAMENT

As your preparations for the 2012 State High School Baseball Tournament are being finalized, it is important that you know the legal obligations regarding the use of the tournament title and/or logo.

Kentucky National Insurance/KHSAA State High School Baseball Tournament is a registered trademark of the Kentucky High School Athletic Association. Any use of this term dealing with sports, recreation, games and athletics must be approved by the Kentucky High School Athletic Association prior to such usage. As such, you should guard against any t-shirt, hat, button, etc. that uses the event title in any way, shape, form or fashion. You should also be mindful that the KHSAA has granted exclusive novelty rights for the event, so this further restricts the ability of outside vendors.

Through 2013, the KHSAA is under a titling agreement with Kentucky National Insurance to serve as the title sponsor of the Boys' State Baseball Tournament. All references to the event shall state the "Kentucky National Insurance/KHSAA State High School Baseball Tournament".

If you desire to use one of the logos in the promotion of the 2012 State High School Baseball Tournament or if you are approached by other events or organization attempting to use it, you must contact Butch Cope for prior approval.

Prior to printing any banners, signs and other materials, you must contact the KHSAA for approval and you must include the registered trademark symbol with any such publication.

The KHSAA will aggressively and actively pursue violators of these trademarks.

FIELD DIMENSIONS

The fence distances at Whitaker Bank Park are 320 feet down the left field line, 318 down the right field line, and 401 to straight away center field. The outfield walls are clearly bordered by a warning track. There is an area deep down each side that is out of play. We will review those areas at the coach's meeting and with the umpires prior to each game.

WHEELCHAIR/A.D.A. ACCOMMODATIONS

Efforts will be made to make a reasonable accommodation for those individuals who may need wheelchair access or other needs due to disability. Please see Butch Cope of the KHSAA, or Gary Durbin of the Legends staff upon arrival for instructions. Due to insurance and other concerns, there will be NO wheelchairs allowed on the field level for any reason.

TICKET SALES

All tickets will be sold through the Legends Box Office and through the KHSAA web site, which will link you to the sales site for the tournament. The ticket link will be posted on the KHSAA website. Normal ticket hours for the box office are 9:00 to 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday. In addition, the box office will be open beginning at 4:00 p.m. on Championship Saturday. The box office phone is 859-422-7867.

Advance tickets at a discounted price are available by calling the box office at Whitaker Bank Park prior to the close of business (5:00 p.m. ET) on Sunday, June 3 for each team's first round game or purchasing online via the KHSAA web site, and click on the links to order tickets (<http://www.khsaa.org/baseball/2012>).

Advance tickets (purchased prior to the close of business on Sunday, June 3) will be priced at \$8 per ticket for the General Admission area, and \$12 for the Home Plate (lower level BLUE) seating areas, with children 2 and under admitted free.

There will also be discounted tickets available for advancing teams. Following each game, the box office will remain open one-half hour after the games are complete to sell advance tickets for the team's next round game at \$8.00 per ticket. Once this time period closes, tickets will be full priced for that team's next game. Fans should pay attention to the public address announcements regarding tickets following the completion of each game.

At the gate and at all other times, tickets will be priced at \$10 for General Admission (two games), and \$14 for the Home Plate area.

Admission gates and ticket booths will open one hour before the start of the first game each day. **Please advise your fans that the gates will not open until this time. In addition, please remind your fans that if they wait until the last minute to arrive, there have historically been long lines at the box offices most noticeably for the State Championship game.**

PARKING

Parking will be in the normal home game parking lots adjacent to the baseball park. Team bus drivers should enter as directed in these instructions to minimize problems. Public parking will be \$3 and will be managed by the Lexington Legends Professional Baseball Club which owns the parking rights. Each team will receive five (5) parking passes to include your team bus and any administrators.

SCHOOL PRESS REPRESENTATIVES

Participating schools are allowed one (1) single press pass (field level only). This should include your yearbook, newspaper or video yearbook personnel. Each principal is responsible with submitting a written request with the name of the individual to the KHSAA by 6 p.m. Sunday, June 2 using KHSAA Form SI103. No school media representatives will be admitted at the gate the day of the game. No school media personnel will be admitted to the press box. The school media pass is just that, for a member of the student body. Outside professional photographers or other individuals should contact KHSAA Sports information Director Elden May regarding credential policies and procedures prior to the event.

COMPLIMENTARY TICKETS/PASSES/ADMISSION POLICY

No passes other than those produced for the championships will be honored at the gate. Each team will be provided 16 armbands upon arrival for admission to the event for non-players and the rest of the team travel party (Head Coach, Assistant Coaches Superintendent, Athletic Director, Trainer, etc.). Participants will be admitted in uniform as a group at the Pass gate. The maximum number of individuals in the dugout is 30, of which only 21 shall be dressed in full game-day gear uniform. All other individuals must have a ticket for admission.

PARTICIPANTS (FIELD ACCESS), TEAM MEMBERS/COACHES/ADMINISTRATION

The entire team should enter as a group, including all managers, coaches, administrators and doctors, utilizing the pass gate near the main entrance to the park (GATE 1). All other coaches and members of the traveling party who are not in possession of a credential will not be entitled to complimentary admission and will be directed to a ticket window. No pass outs will be issued as all persons leaving the park will be directed to a ticket window for return admission.

When teams arrive at the park, entry should be made through the Pass Gate near the main entrance. It should be noted that the school will be held accountable for the conduct of all persons in the dugout area. When in doubt, those people who have no direct responsibility during the game should be in the stands! **TEAMS FAILING TO TURN IN THE PASS LIST (FOR THE 16 ARMBANDS) AS REQUESTED WILL NOT BE ALLOWED COMPLIMENTARY ADMISSION.**

The tournament rules in the KHSAA Handbook clearly state that no other player may be in uniform other than the twenty-one designated for that game. Whether it is by different pants or a different top, the others must be unique. To violate this rule jeopardizes insurance coverage, both liability and medical, as it would be a violation of the tournament rules. This has been consistently interpreted as such and is done so in other sports. If you have received inconsistent information from other sources, we apologize, but this is the final answer, there can be no more than twenty-one (21) in the game uniform. Thanks for your cooperation.

SCOREBOARD PHOTOS

On Wednesday and Thursday, the winning teams of the quarterfinal round games will have their photos taken immediately following their game for use on the video board for the remainder of the tournament. We appreciate your cooperation in arranging for a game jersey to be available for each of your players to have his picture made (head and shoulders only), to allow the Legends technical staff ample time to prepare.

TIMETABLE FOR TOURNAMENT

Enclosed is a complete timetable of the events surrounding the tournament. Please be familiar with this timetable and adhere to the restrictions that are in place.

PRACTICE PRIOR TO THE GAME, BATTING CAGES, PRE-GAME WARM-UP TIME ON FIELD

NO ADDITIONAL PRACTICE MAY BE SCHEDULED BY ANY COMPETING TEAM USING WHITAKER BANK BALLPARK DURING THE WEEK OF THE TOURNAMENT IN ORDER TO ENSURE ALL TEAMS EQUAL ACCESS.

Teams are not allowed to use Whitaker Bank Ball Park for practice other than for pre-game warm-ups. Local schools may be willing and able to assist you in locating practice facilities. This ensures equal access to Whitaker Bank Park for all teams.

The batting cage behind the right field wall will be available prior to a team's scheduled games, in 45 minute blocks. Competing teams should work together to coordinate time usage. The KHSAA staff will assist in the event of dispute.

On the days of the tournament, the teams may not be on the field except as detailed in the timetable. There will be no exceptions and schools violating this policy face the possibility of a fine or other punishment permissible by KHSAA Bylaw 33. It is imperative that the grounds crew has adequate time to perform their functions.

BETWEEN INNINGS

Between innings, the team taking the field, particularly the pitcher, should delay approximately one minute before leaving the dugout. There are many promotions and other activities surrounding the games, and we don't want players warming up and standing waiting for a promotion or activity to end.

HOME AND VISITING TEAM AND DUGOUTS AND LOCKERS

The team in the top bracket of the tournament draw will be the home team in all games and use the first base dugout. A representative of the school and the KHSAA playoff staff will inspect the dugout before and after the game. It is expected that the dugouts will be left in the same condition it is found. The KHSAA will take whatever action is necessary including fining the particular school and assessing the cost for cleanup to those schools leaving the dugouts in unsatisfactory condition or damaging any of the field property.

The team in the bottom bracket of the tournament draw will be the visiting team in all games and use the third base dugout.

A representative of the school and the KHSAA playoff staff will inspect the dugout before and after the game. It is expected that the dugouts will be left in the same condition it is found. The KHSAA will take whatever action is necessary including fining the particular school and assessing the cost for cleanup to those schools leaving the dugouts in unsatisfactory condition or damaging any of the field property.

There will be no locker room facilities available at the park. Teams should be prepared for play upon arrival.

All squad members and coaches shall adhere to NFHS playing rules and remain in the dugout unless occupying a fielding position, base, batters box, on-deck circle, coaching box or warming up in the bullpen.

COLOR OF JERSEY

The home team will wear its light colored jersey and the visiting team will wear its dark colored jersey. KHSAA staff will resolve conflicts regarding these issues and both teams should be prepared to have both light and dark jerseys available.

UMPIRES

Sixteen umpires have been appointed and assigned by the Kentucky High School Athletic Association.

BENCH DECORUM

The KHSAA will instruct the umpires to enforce the rules of the game regarding bench conduct and the coaching boxes. With the continued emphasis on sportsmanship and the high profile nature of the state tournament, there should be no need for further reminders about the conduct of the coaching staff and other personnel on the bench, including actions, gestures and language. In light of recent Board of Control emphasis on conduct, the umpires have been instructed to ensure that all rules are enforced within the NFHS Rules and other books.

GAME BALLS AND BALL RETRIEVERS

For Tournament games, the Rawlings Company will be providing the Rawlings R100KY raised seam baseball as the game balls. Each team is expected to help in the retrieval of foul balls down their side to make certain that the best possible balls are being used. We ask teams to provide one ball person for their game.

TOWELS AND OTHER SUPPLIES

The Association does not provide towels for the teams participating in the tournament. Your school will need to inform the participants to bring a towel if they need one for any reason.

OFFICIAL STATS

The KHSAA provides official statistics for the games through the outstanding services of WL Stats. Due to space constraints, there is no space provided for team statisticians in the press box. All team stat personnel must stay within the dugout during the entire game or be positioned in the stands. The stats results will be posted on the KHSAA web site immediately after each game.

TRAINERS/DOCTORS AND EMERGENCY TREATMENT

UK Healthcare Offices will be providing training services for the games. They intend to have a certified and/or student trainer at field level at all times.

Each team is also entitled to have its own team doctor available and an ambulance will be available. Please feel free to utilize these important services that are provided by the representatives of the Lexington community.

Should emergency medical treatment be necessary, Lexington Fayette Fire Department EMTs will be transporting the injured person(s) to the St. Joseph Hospital in Lexington. The member school administration is responsible for ensuring that the parental permission to seek medical treatment is authorized from each participant. The Principal, Athletic Director and/or the Head Coach can use a copy of KHSAA Form GE04 (the physical exam form) for this purpose as this form contains appropriate language.

PRESENTATION OF TROPHIES

Each school is to designate a representative to be on the field immediately following the semifinal and championship games to receive the trophy and medals. It is hoped that the Principal, A.D. or Head Coach will perform this duty. No presentation of any trophy will be made until the field of play is cleared of all fans, coaches and players. Please return to the dugouts as soon as possible following the game so the presentations can begin.

The semifinalist trophy, medallions and all-tournament awards will be presented immediately following the team's loss in Friday night play.

VIDEOTAPING/MEDIA/ FILM

Press, radio and TV representative's passes will be made available upon request by having the outlets contact the KHSAA in advance. If you have media covering your team, they should contact Elden May, Sports Information Director, not later than Sunday, June 3 at 5 p.m.

There shall be no other videotaping of any baseball tournament game, other than by KHSAA designees and outlets or by persons whose entire taping unit can be contained within their seat and present no obstruction to other spectators. (No tripod, external power sources, or use of the Whitaker Bank Ball Park power sources). IT IS IMPERATIVE THAT YOUR REITERATE THIS TO YOUR FANS TO PREVENT REPEATING OF PREVIOUS PROBLEMS. Due to space constraints, schools will NOT be afforded an opportunity to videotape contests played during the state tournament from the video decks or utilizing tripods or external power sources. Taping can be done from the confines of a seat or an area that does not restrict fan viewing.

POST GAME MEDIA INTERVIEWS

All post games media interviews are to be done in the vicinity of the dugout. With the tight timetable, the field playing area is cleared as soon as possible to prepare for the next game. Please inform your local media of the need to adhere to this restriction.

FAN BEHAVIOR AND ACTIONS

No one outside of the team is to come on the playing field. Fans are to stay in the stands before, during and after the game. Please make several announcements to this effect to the student body during the week before the game.

SIGNS, BANNERS, NOISEMAKERS

No posters or signs of any kind will be permitted to be affixed (with glue, tape string or other devices) by any official or unofficial school representative to any permanent surface of the park. No signage posted on behalf of a school may contain derogatory language or sayings or contain the name of the opponent or any of its players. Please make certain all pep, spirit and support organizations are aware of this rule.

No electronic amplification equipment will be allowed in the park (excepting band instruments used in conjunction with the official high school band and its performance), nor any other electronic noisemaker. This includes stereos, speakers, cannons, electronic horns, tanks, etc. In addition, no recorded music or other type of reproduction subject to copyright restrictions will be permitted.

INCLEMENT WEATHER STATEMENT

With the possibility of inclement weather, we remind you that you should be prepared to move to a place of shelter in the event of bad weather conditions. Should it begin to rain, the games will continue on schedule unless there are signs of lightning or the umpires in consultation with tournament management determine that it is unsafe to continue.

Should weather conditions force a postponement or delay, you should immediately leave the bleacher area and heed any announcements made by tournament management. Should evacuation become necessary, please observe the directions

given by uniformed officers as well as tournament officials. In accordance with adopted KHSAA policy, if the games are suspended, the minimum suspension will be 30 minutes after the last sight of lightning or sound of thunder.

Persons leaving the park should seek shelter in their mode of transportation. In all circumstances, use prudent judgment in determining whether or not you should remain in the dugout or bleachers. When the decision is made to resume the games, there will be announcements made throughout the park area, and prior to the resumption of play, a fifteen minute warm-up period will be given to both teams. The KHSAA pitching limitations are in force irrespective of weather conditions or cancellations.

HEAT INDEX

Tournament play will adhere to the Heat Index. Tournament administration, working with the UK Healthcare staff will be responsible for tracking and implementing the Heat Index Program and its guidelines. Should the heat index reach 95, All play shall stop and the heat index monitored every 30 minutes.

REMINDER

PLEASE NOTIFY YOUR NON COMPETING STUDENTS THAT THEY ARE NOT TO COME ON THE PLAYING FIELD PRIOR TO, DURING, OR FOLLOWING THE GAME.

EXPENSE REIMBURSEMENT

GENERAL POLICY

An expense allowance will be calculated for lodging and meals and shall be paid for a traveling squad of 24 persons in the following manner.

LODGING

Schools failing to stay within assigned lodging arrangements will forfeit the lodging allowance. The lodging allowance shall be \$13.00 per night due to the reduced rate as part of the Lexington package, and will be paid for a maximum of 24 persons, and will be paid for only the nights that lodging is utilized. No school within a forty-mile one-way distance from Lexington will be reimbursed lodging. Your school is responsible for all bills for lodging, and you will be reimbursed the lodging allowance. Please have your school or Board of Education's Sales Tax Exempt number with you at check in to allow the hotel to deduct the sales tax from the room bill.

MEALS

A meal allowance of \$5.00 per meal will be reimbursed for a maximum of 24 persons with the amount of meals corresponding to the use of housing and for a maximum of three meals per tournament day and additional meals for the travel day(s). Your school is responsible for all meal arrangements for your team,

MILEAGE

Each school is reimbursed \$1.00 per mile, round trip for one vehicle, from the school location to Lexington, in accordance with mileage numbers provided by the American Automobile Association.

RECEIVING YOUR REIMBURSEMENT

Your expense check will be mailed from the KHSAA offices not later than 30 days following the finals.
