Coach's Comments

Your team's accomplishment of advancing to the State Tournament:
 Won 4th straight 14th District championship, finishing 9-0 against district competition. Won 4th straight 4th Region championship, the first team to do so since Owensboro in 1922-1926. Went 19-1 against region competition. Won 18 straight games entering the Sweet 16, the second best winning streak in school history. 1-1 versus teams in the Sweet 16. Won Monticello Bank Classic. Finished 2nd in Ashland Invitational. Senior class has a career record of 110-19, the best record of any Warren Central class. Finished 78-2 against 4th Region foes, 35-0 against the 14th District, both records. Troy McFarland has played in every single game, the most in Warren Central history.

Coach's Comments

What are keys (players/offensive/defensive) to your team's success in winning the tournament:
 Troy McFarland should be the key player, bringing his experience to the floor that he gained by playing in 8 games in the Sweet 16. He has the ability to do everything on the floor, from strong defensive pressure to scoring to passing. Also key is Jeremy Anderson, the team's leading scorer. If he can find his shot early in the game it can help us get an early start to the game. And that really is a general key to each game in general. If we can get out to an early lead and set up our press, we can dictate the pace of the game from then on and put the pressure on the opposition. Our press will be key in forcing some turnovers and getting those easy baskets in transition. Finally our depth will be key as there are very few teams that go as deep as we do, and that gives us the advantage in the fourth quarter.
