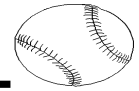

ASHLAND TO OWENSBORO

Take I-64 W to Lexington and stay on I-64W to Louisville. Continue on I-64W through Southern Indiana until exit number 57, US-231 - toward DALE/ JASPER/ HUNTINTON. Turn left onto US-231/ IN-45S. Continue to follow US-231S; this will become US-60W. See links below for Team approved lodging facilities directions.

Merge onto US-60 BYP west, via exit number 70B on the left toward AUDUBON PKWY/ OWENSBORO/ HENDERSON. See links below for Team approved lodging facilities directions

Take I-24 E to the Western Kentucky Parkway east exit number 42- toward Princeton/Elizabethtown. Merge onto Wendell H Ford Western Kentucky Pkwy (east). Take the US-431/KY-70 exit number 58- toward Drakesboro/Central City. Turn right onto US-431 N/KY-70 W. Continue to follow US-431 N. turn left onto W 2nd ST/US-60 W. LEXINGTON AREA TO OWENSBORO

New Circle Road Merge on (US60W) via Exit5B towards Martha Layne Collins Bluegrass Parkway. Take Martha Layne Collins Bluegrass Parkway ramp toward Lawrenceburg/Elizabethtown, Merge onto Martha Layne Collins Bluegrass Parkway West. Merge on I-65 via Exit 1B on the left toward Wendell H Ford Western Ky. Parkway/Nashville/Paducah. Take Wendell H Ford Western Ky. Parkway/US-31W/KY-61N exit, Exit 91, toward Elizabethtown/Owensboro/Paducah. Merge onto Wendell Ford Western Ky. Pkwy VIA EXIT on left toward Owensboro/Paducah. Merge on William H. The rate for team rooms only will be \$79.00 plus tax. Once a team is given their assigned motel by Mr. Bratcher they may share it with their fans. We would recommend that you make your reservations in a prompt manner once you have your assignment from Mr. Bratcher. No school is guaranteed a specific hotel. SCHOOLS FAILING TO STAY WITHIN ASSIGNED LODGING ARRANGEMENTS WILL FORFEIT THE LODGING ALLOWANCE. The lodging allowance shall be \$13.00 per night due to the reduced rate as part of the Owensboro package, and will be paid for a maximum of 24 persons. No school within a forty-mile one-way distance from Owensboro will be reimbursed for lodging. Your school is responsible for all bills for lodging, and you will be reimbursed for the lodging allowance. Please have your school or Board of Education's Sales Tax Exempt number with you at check-in to allow the hotel to deduct the sales tax from the room bill.

PRE-TOURNAMENT EVENTS

Due to playing on Thursday evening, the pre-tournament ceremony will not be as long or as detailed as it has been in the past. The ceremonies will begin at 12:00 p.m. Each team will need to sit together at the tables provided by Owensboro Sports Center. Lunch will be provided. All teams, head coaches and umpires are to be in attendance. All players and coaches should be in school apparel (i.e. school colors, school tee shirts). School banners and flags are welcome. There will be an introduction of teams, a few welcoming/opening remarks, and all seniors will be provided with a commemorative game ball from KHSAA Commissioner Julian Tackett. Parents and fans are welcome to attend the ceremonies and will be allowed to sit in the bleachers, but will not be provided lunch. Following the Opening Ceremonies at 1:15 p.m. there will be a meeting with the coaches followed by an umpire's meeting at 1:45 p.m. All coaches and umpires are expected to attend. The dress will be causal.

The Fast Pitch State Championship Softball Game will be played Saturday June 11, at 1:00 p.m. CST. The second game, if necessary will immediately follow the completion of the first game.

FIELD DIMENSIONS

The fence distances at the Jack C. Fisher Softball Complex are 210 feet down the left field line, 210 down the right field line, and 210 to straight away center field. We will review ground rules at the coach's and umpires meeting.

WHEELCHAIR/A.D.A. ACCOMMODATIONS

Efforts will be made to make a reasonable accommodation for those individuals who may need wheelchair access or other needs due to disability. Please see Darren Bilberry or Kerry Bodenheimer upon arrival for instructions. Due to insurance and other concerns, there will be NO wheelchairs allowed on the field level for any reason.

TICKET SALES

"All Day Armbands" and "All Session Armbands" will be sold online in advance and at the park each day of the tournament. "All Day Armbands" will be \$5 per person on Thursday evening and \$10 per person on Friday and Saturday. Children under ten will be admitted free. "All Session Armbands" will be \$15 per person. **We will take both cash and credit as acceptable methods of payment.** There will be no reserve seats sold for the tournament. It is suggested that you bring a lawn chair. The gates will open at 3:30 p.m. on Thursday and 7:30 a.m. on Friday and Saturday. Please advise your fans that the gates will not open until this time. Fans will not be allowed to bring coolers and drinks into the park and ball diamond area. Tickets can be purchased online by clicking on the following link:

COMPLIMENTARY TICKETS/PASSES/ADMISSION POLICY

No passes other than those produced for the championships will be honored at the gate. Principal, Coach, Athletic Director, Official passes or any other type of identification will not entitle the holder to admission. Enclosed is a pass list request form (SB116). Each team will be provided 30 individual armbands which must be worn by the participants, coaches and any auxiliary team personnel. The armband will need to be worn for both days of the tournament. **They should not be removed.** Anyone not having the Armband on will be required to purchase a new armband which will be sold at the ticket prices listed above. Only 21 participants may be in the dugout. All other individuals must have a ticket for admission.

TEAMS FAILING TO TURN IN THE PASS LIST AS REQUESTED WILL NOT BE ALLOWED COMPLIMENTARY ADMISSION.

A maximum of thirty (30) individuals listed on the team pass list entering with the coach will be admitted at the pass gate. The pass list form is attached and should be submitted to the KHSAA by fax (859-293-5999)-on or before Monday, June 6, 2011. The entire team should enter as a group, including all managers, coaches, administrators and trainers, utilizing the pass gate. All other coaches and members of the traveling party who are not on the prior school pass list will not be entitled to complimentary admission and will be directed to a ticket table. Teams wishing to leave the park and return will have to be wearing the approved armband.

When teams arrive at the park, entry should be made through the **Pass Gate** near the main entrance to the park. **The tournament rules in the KHSAA Handbook state that no player may be in uniform other than the twenty-one designated for that game.** Whether it is by different pants or a different top, the others must be unique. Violation of this rule jeopardizes liability and medical insurance coverage.

BUS PARKING

Buses will drop off teams and team personnel at the team **pass gate**.

GENERAL PUBLIC PARKING

Parking for the general public will be in the normal home game parking lots adjacent to the softball complex. Team bus drivers should enter as directed by the park personnel to minimize problems.

Plan B Parking

If a large amount of rain prior to the tournament eliminates parking on the grass at Jack C Fisher Park, off site parking (Plan B) will be made available at Bellevue Baptist Church when all permanent parking spaces are occupied at the park. Shuttles will transport spectators to Jack C Fisher Park. Spectators are urged to arrive at least 30 minutes prior to the start of scheduled game times.

Plan B Directions

Parking attendants will direct spectators to continue from the park entrance west on West Fifth Street Road. From there they should follow the KHSAA Parking Detour signs.

PRACTICE PRIOR TO THE GAME, WARM-UP TIME

There will be no pre-tournament team practice this year. Each participating team will be allowed **10 minutes** infield practice the first time they play on Thursday. After that, we will make every effort to adhere to the time schedule. No scheduled games will be started earlier than the designated time.

INFIELD PRACTICE

There will be **NO** infield practice while field maintenance is taking place.

SPECTATOR SEATING

Teams and spectators are asked to be respectful of the opposing team's spectator area. It is generally accepted that the first base team will occupy seating from center back stop fence to their dugout. The third base dugout team should occupy from center backstop fence to third base.

HOME AND VISITING TEAM AND DUGOUTS

The team in the top bracket of the tournament draw will occupy the third base dugout with the exception of the Championship Game. The home team will be designated by a coin toss during the pre-game meeting. Each team is expected to police their dugout area after each game.

CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

The upper bracket winner will have the option to be the home team in the State Championship Game. In the event it is necessary to play a second game, the home team will be designated by a coin toss during the pre-game meeting

PLAYING RULES AND REGULATIONS (ALL TOURNAMENTS)

National Federation Playing Rules will be utilized. A school may enter a team composed of twenty-one (21) players in each post-season tournament game. These players must appear on the eligibility list submitted to the District Tournament Manager. The twenty one (21) players must be designated each game, and no other players may be in uniform.

GAME ENDING PROCEDURES/SPEED-UP RULES/RUN RULES/COURTESY RUNNERS

In accordance with National Federation Softball Rule 4-2-2, the Mercy run rule will be observed. This allows a game to end anytime after 2 ½ or 3 innings when a team is 15 or more runs behind or 4 ½ or 5 innings when a team is 10 or more runs behind and has completed its turn at bat. Any post season contest that is suspended /interrupted shall be continued from the point of suspension/interruption at a later time. It will be continued from the point of suspension/interruption, with the lineup and batting order of each team exactly the same as the lineup and batting order at the moment of suspension. The regular season tie-breaker procedure will **NOT** be used during the post season. The speed-up rules provisions, allowing for a courtesy runner for the pitcher and catcher when they reach base, **WILL** be used in all post season games.

UMPIRES

The umpires have been assigned and approved by the Kentucky High School Athletic Association in accordance with Bylaw 29.

GAME BALLS

For the championship games, the Rawlings Company will be providing the Optic Yellow (12Y47L) softball (.47 COR).

TOWELS AND OTHER SUPPLIES

The Association does not provide towels for the teams participating in the tournament. Your school will need to inform the participants to bring towels if they need one for any reason.

OFFICIAL STATS

The Owensboro Parks and Recreation Department will provide official statistics for the games. Due to space constraints, there is no space provided for team statisticians in the press box. All team stat personnel must stay within the dugout during the entire game or be positioned in the stands. The line scores will be posted on the KHSAA web site at the conclusion of each day.

TRAINERS/DOCTORS AND EMERGENCY TREATMENT

The Owensboro Parks and Recreation Department will be providing training services for the games. They intend to have a certified and/or student trainer on site at all times.

Each team is also entitled to have its own team doctor/trainer and an ambulance will be available. Please feel free to utilize these important services that are provided by the representatives of the Owensboro community.

Should emergency medical treatment be necessary, the Daviess County Yellow Ambulance Service, provided by Owensboro Mercy Health Systems, will be transporting the injured person(s) to the area hospital. The member school administration is responsible for ensuring that parental permission to seek medical treatment is authorized from each participant. The Principal, Athletic Director and/or the Head Coach can use a copy of KHSAA Form GE04 (the physical exam form) for this purpose as this form contains appropriate language.

PRESENTATION OF TROPHIES

Each school is to designate a representative to be on the field immediately following the game to receive the trophy and medals. It is hoped that the Principal, Athletic Director or Head Coach will perform this duty. No presentation of any trophy will be made until the field of play is cleared of all fans, coaches and players. Please return to the dugout area as soon as possible following the game so the presentations can begin.

ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM

The All-Tournament Team will consist of 11 players including an MVP. The championship team will be guaranteed three players on the All -Tournament team plus an MVP. The runner-up team will be guaranteed three players on the All Tournament team. The two semi-finalists teams will be guaranteed two players each on the all tournament.

MEDIA/VIDEO TAPING/FILM

Press, radio and TV representative's passes will be made available upon request by having the outlets complete the online media credential in advance which is located at the following link on the KHSAA Website <http://credentials.khsaa.org/>. If you have a radio outlet covering your team, they should contact Elden May, Sports Information Director at 859-299-5472, not later than Monday, June 6th. There shall be no other videotaping of any softball tournament game, other than by KHSAA designees and outlets or by persons whose entire taping unit can be contained within their seat and present no obstruction to other spectators. (No tripod, external power sources, or use of the Jack C. Fisher Park power sources). IT IS IMPERATIVE THAT YOU REITERATE THIS TO YOUR FANS TO PREVENT REPEATING OF PREVIOUS PROBLEMS.

If you have school media covering your team, they should complete KHSAA Form SI103 (KHSAA School Media Credential Request Application) and fax to Elden May (859) 293-5999, not later than noon, Monday June 6, 2011. This request must be received by the KHSAA by the required deadline. One (1) media credential from each participating school will be allowed.

POST GAME MEDIA INTERVIEWS

All post games media interviews are to be done in the vicinity of the dugout. With the tight timetable, the field playing area needs to be cleared as soon as possible to prepare for the next game. Please inform your local media of the need to adhere to this restriction.

FAN BEHAVIOR AND ACTIONS

No one outside of the team is to come on the playing field. Fans are to stay in the stands before, during and after the game. Please make several announcements to this effect to the student body during the week before the game.

SIGNS, BANNERS, NOISEMAKERS

No posters or signs of any kind will be permitted to be adhered (with glue, tape string or other devices) by any official or unofficial school representative to any permanent surface of the park. No signage posted on behalf of a school may contain derogatory language or contain the name of the opponent or any of its players. Please make certain all pep, spirit and support organizations are aware of this rule.

No electronic amplification equipment will be allowed in the park (except band instruments used in conjunction with the official high school band and its performance), nor any other electronic, mechanical or semi-mechanical noisemaker.

INCLEMENT WEATHER STATEMENT

With the possibility of inclement weather (to include thunder), we remind you that you should be prepared to move to a place of shelter in the event of bad weather conditions. Should it begin to rain, the games will continue on schedule unless there are signs of lightning or the umpires in consultation with tournament management determine that it is unsafe to continue.

Should weather conditions force a postponement or delay, you should immediately leave the bleacher area and heed any announcements made by tournament management. Should evacuation become necessary, please observe the directions given by uniformed officers as well as tournament officials. In accordance with adopted KHSAA policy, if the games are suspended, the minimum suspension will be 30 minutes after the last sight of lightning or sound of thunder. Persons leaving the park should seek shelter in their mode of transportation. In all circumstances, use prudent judgment in determining whether or not you should remain in the dugout or bleachers. When the decision is made to resume the games, there will be announcements made throughout the park area, and prior to the resumption of play; a fifteen minute warm-up period will be given to both teams.

REMINDER

PLEASE NOTIFY YOUR NON-COMPETING STUDENTS THAT THEY ARE NOT TO COME ON THE PLAYING FIELD PRIOR TO, DURING, OR FOLLOWING THE GAME.

REIMBURSEMENT POLICY

An expense allowance will be calculated for lodging and meals and shall be paid for a traveling squad of 24 persons in the following manner.

LODGING

Schools failing to stay within assigned lodging arrangements will forfeit the lodging allowance. The lodging allowance shall be \$13.00 per night (per person) due to the reduced rate as part of the Owensboro package, and will be paid for a maximum of 24 persons, and will be paid for only the nights that lodging is utilized. No school within a forty-mile one-way distance from Owensboro will be reimbursed lodging. Your school is responsible for all bills for lodging, and you will be reimbursed the lodging allowance. Please have your school or Board of Education's Sales Tax Exempt number with you at check in to allow the hotel to deduct the sales tax from the room bill.

MEALS

A meal allowance of \$5.00 per meal will be reimbursed for a maximum of 24 persons with the amount of meals corresponding to the use of housing and for a maximum of three meals per tournament day and additional meals for the travel day(s). Your school is responsible for all meal arrangements for your team,

TRANSPORTATION/MILEAGE

In accordance with Bylaw 20, the principal, coach or another member of the faculty shall accompany the team to all contests. His/her expenses, when he/she accompanies the contestants, shall be paid in the same manner as those of the contestants. The rate to be reimbursed for state championship play is \$1 per mile (round trip) for one bus.

In addition, I have ensured that my athletes are each aware of the uniform rules and restrictions, and will adhere to those provisions.
