



SUMMARY OF 2009 and 2010 FOOTBALL ALIGNMENT RESPONSES AND ACTION BY THE BOARD OF CONTROL

The KHSAA received the following written requests for alignment adjustments to the 2009 and 2010 alignment. Listed is the request, along with the Board of Control action on the request.

Berea	Request to move from District 5 to District 6 in Class 1A	Approved. Not only geographically defensible, but also allows for addition of team in District 1-5 as requested
East Carter	Requested to move up in class to Class 4A due to geographic concerns	Approved for the 2009 and 2010 seasons
Johnson Central	Made request to play in Class 4A due to geographic and current student population concerns.	Denied request. To approve request would have placed a different enrollment standard on this one school compared with the other 219. In addition, another school with exactly the same two-year average enrollment remains in Class 5A. Geography of this district will be thoroughly reviewed as Board works toward 2011 and beyond alignment during 2008-2009 school year.
Madisonville-North Hopkins	Request to return to Class 5A for 2009 and 2010. Original written request was for 2007 and 2008 only per alignment parameters at that time, and school desired to be placed in proper class	Approved for the 2009 and 2010 seasons.
Rose Hill Christian	Request to be placed in District 5 of Class 1A	Approved to be eligible for district championship play in 2009.
Class 6A, Districts 7 and 8	Five schools made a written request for a revision in this district to make the division of teams geographical in nature with the addition of Bryan Station and removal of Shelby County from the 2008 alignment.	Based on map available, approved placing Bryan Station, Lafayette, Paul Dunbar and Scott County in one district, George Rogers Clark, Henry Clay, Madison Central and Tates Creek in the other district.

There were requests made prior to the original draft being released that were considered by the Board of Control at the May meeting. This includes, but is not limited to, the following requests.

Ashland Blazer	Requested to move from Class 5A to Class 4A for 2009 due to geographic problems with enrollment and enrollment decline since adoption of alignment.	Denied request. To approve request would have placed a different enrollment standard on this one school compared with the other 219. In addition, another school with exactly the same two-year average enrollment remains in Class 5A. Geography of this district will be thoroughly reviewed as Board works toward 2011 and beyond alignment during 2008-2009 school year.
Fort Knox	Requested to move from Class 2A to Class 1A	Board denied request. Had wholesale realignment been done, Fort Knox did not fall into the bottom 37 enrollment listing when member schools were ranked by enrolled boyx.
